SCRIMMAGES IN TRAINING

Probably the most frustrating thing for me to see when observing a training session is when the session is over and the players didn't scrimmage at all. It always makes me think back to when I first started playing soccer and my reasons for playing. I didn't play because I enjoyed drills. I didn't play because I enjoyed hearing the coach speak. I played because I enjoyed playing soccer. Every year more and more people start to play the great game of soccer, which is wonderful. The sad thing is that every year we lose players when they turn 12, 13 and 14. There are numerous possible reasons for this, but without a doubt a big reason is that coaches find a way to take the fun out of the game.

Coaches should organize the training sessions so that they build from start to finish with the finish being some type of a scrimmage. If the players don't have some type of a game in their training session, it's an incomplete (and unsuccessful) session in my opinion.

Not only is the scrimmage part of a training session the 'fun' part for most players, it also allows the players to try out what they have been working on in that training session.

I will never forget the coach who told me 'the teams that only work on drills in practice can become very good at those drills but they will never know how to play the game'.

Having a scrimmage doesn't necessarily mean just throwing the ball out and saying, 'play'. Start the scrimmage with restrictions or limitations, but before it's over lift the restrictions and let them play. The best way to learn the game is through playing the game (there certainly can still be some teaching and learning taking place during the scrimmage) and even more important, players will look forward to coming to training sessions.

Here are some examples of games/ scrimmages which provide the players with a purpose, but more importantly are fun.

1. Play 8 minute games; for every game you win, the team earns a point. First team to get three points wins! Repercussions for the losing team. This game sequence will show you which players will compete for you.

2. Play a 10 minute game; play 2-touch when you are in the lead, unlimited touch when you are behind or when the game is tied. Often the team which has to play two-touch will increase their lead because they simplify the game.

3. Play a 10 minute game; when you are ahead, you are not allowed to score, you must possess the ball. When the game is tied or when you are behind, you look to score. The purpose of this game is to see if the players can hold a lead. Are they soccer savvy enough to take time off the clock while maintaining possession?

4. Play a game in which the players have unlimited touches, however, goals can only come off a one-touch shot. Players need to look for good passes to set up their teammates for a one-touch shot.

5. Divide the playing field in a defensive, middle and attacking third. Two-touch in the defensive third, three-touch in the middle third and unlimited touch in the attacking third. Encourages players to take players on in the attacking third.

6. A game in which all the field players have to be across the mid-line in order for a goal to count. Encourages teams to move as a unit, close together. It also works on fitness. You can add the condition that the goal counts double if an opponent is still on the other side of the mid-line when the goal is scored.

7. A game in which you earn a point when you complete a give-and-go (wall pass) anywhere on the field. A goal = two points and a

give-and-go resulting in a goal = three points. In this game you encourage combination play.

ROBS'S RAMBLINGS

With the season winding down I have watched my share of games and I have a few questions for the coaches. These are observations of our opposing coaches, however, these questions can be asked of yourself.

While coaching a game am I:

- a) focused on my team?
- b) focused on the other team?
- c) worried about the other coach?
- d) worried about the parents on the sidelines?

Let's discuss each option:

- a) I'll analyze the team shape on offense and defense as well as the off-the-ball movement of the players.
- b) Throughout the season, most of the practice time is focused on what we want to do as a team, however, during the games often all we focus on is what the other team is doing. We have to be aware of their game plan, but we must stick to ours as well. I'll analyze the other team's formation and key players.
- c) I have been known to worry about the other coach and let them get into my head. Here is a tip if you want to get me loose my focus; yell constantly. This annoys me more than anything. When I get annoyed it will affect my players.
- d) We played a team this past weekend and I actually heard a Dad threaten one of my players on the field. The exact quote was "Number 12 if you keep slide tackling, I will come out there and

break your jaw!" My first response was laughter. The guy's an idiot and I cannot believe he said that, but as I watched him the rest of the game, pacing up and down the sidelines yelling at my players, I got nervous. Thankfully, nothing happened but this situation deserves your attention. I was not worried about my number 12 because she easily could beat me up.

I have been very fortunate to have well-behaved parents on my teams, but some coaches are not so lucky. If you worry about what the parents are thinking or saying then you will not be focused on the game.

A few years ago I had a Dad of a U18 player who yelled instructions to his daughter throughout the game. These instructions were all wrong and the player became extremely frustrated. In practice, this player would do everything I asked of her and would play very well, then in the games she would play poorly. After a few games of this I finally went up to her and asked her if she listened to her Dad when she was at home. She rolled her eyes and her response was: "No, my Dad is such a dork". So I asked her why she listened to him during the game. She looked at me and smiled. From then on she played terrific in all the games. I also spoke with the Dad and tried to get him on the same page. The Dad went on to become one of the biggest supporters of the team. Sometimes, educating the parents is one of the hardest jobs, but it can make your life much easier.

INDOOR SOCCER – WINTER TRAINING

BC Force has secured practice times at the 'Off-the-Boards' Indoor facility in Gunbarrel. We've managed to obtain the 4:00 pm until 7:00 PM time slots on Mondays through Fridays starting Monday, November 22 throughout the month of January. Each age group will have 16 training sessions. The sessions will be run by our staff coaches Rob Johnson, Hardy Kalisher, John Wood and John Welsch. The cost for all 16 sessions will be \$150 per player.
