As a club we try to give some time off to the players and staff but we go from the Rocky Mountain Cup to the Fall season in just a matter of weeks. I feel that the girls' program had a terrific Spring season. I will address each age group and share a bit about each team.

U11's

The Red team played in Premier 2 and finished the season 4-2-4 and in fifth place. This Fall they will be in Premier 2 again. They ended the season by winning the Rocky Mountain Cup. They are also participating in the North Carolina Girls Soccer Camp.

The Tar Heels team played in Challenge 1 with a record of 3-5-2. Carlos Real will continue with this team and I foresee a strong season.

The Pilots team played in Challenge 2 with a record of 3-6-1. Coach Katie did a great job with this team. For the 2006/2007 season this team will have a new coach.

Ryan Henkel will be overseeing the U11 and U12 age groups as Director of Coaching Youth Girls. I have had several conversations with Ryan and I am looking forward to seeing what he can bring to both these age groups. He has some exciting ideas and I feel that he will create the foundation that we need to make the girls' program an even bigger success.

U12's

The Red team played in Premier 2 with a 9-0-1 record and winning the championship. This Fall they will move up to Premier 1. The team finished second at the Real Cup and won the Rocky Mountain Cup. Heather Solar will coach this team for the 2006-2007 season.

The Tar Heels team played in Challenge 2, finished with a 6-2-2 record and will move up to Challenge 1. Charles

Bloomfield has this team moving right along and I think they could be playing in the Classic division soon.

U13's

The Red team played in Challenge 1 with a record of 9-0-1 and winning the championship. They will move up to the Classic division. I will coach this team for the upcoming season.

The Tar Heels team played in Challenge 2 with a 2-6-2 record. They had a difficult year with some unfortunate injuries. Jed Marquis will be the new coach for this team for the upcoming season.

Heather Solar will oversee the U13 and U14 age groups as Director of Coaching Junior Girls. Her enthusiasm and passion will provide a spark for our girls to make them skilled and confident players. Heather is another piece of the puzzle which will make our girls' program the best it can be.

U14's

The Red team played in Premier 1 with a record of 4-3-3. Heather Solar had this team playing terrific soccer. They would have won the Rocky Mountain Cup, however, we asked the team to play 'up' in the U16 age group in which they went 2-2-0.

The Red II team playing in the Classic division went 3-4-3. Jenny Jurkowski will coach the team this Fall.

The Tar Heels team played in the Classic division as well and finished 2-8-0. Untimely injuries hurt their season, however, coach Anselmo will have the team ready for a strong Fall season.

The Amazon team played in Challenge 1 with a record of 1-9-0. Injuries decimated this team.

The Pilots team struggled while playing in Challenge 2 with a record of 1-9-0. The team often played short due to injuries.

Unfortunately we were not allowed to combine the Pilots and Amazon team, which would have been a better situation for all players.

BC Force Boys' Program Update

Rob Johnson has given you an update on the Girls' Program; here is a brief update on the Boys' Program.

Boys U18 Red, Elite 1, record: 1-9-0.

In hindsight, playing at the Elite 1 level was a bit too ambitious for this group. The boys battled hard though and finished the season with a good showing at the Rocky Mountain Cup. Several of these boys will continue to play at the collegiate level.

Boys U17 Red, Elite 2, record: 5-3-2.

A strong season with a 2nd place in the Elite 2 division. They were semi-finalists in the State Cup and finalists at the Rocky Mountain Cup. This team will move up to Elite 1.

Boys 16 Red, Premier 1, record: 6-3-1.

This team is on the right track with a 3rd place in Premier 1, quarter-finalists in State Cup and a Europe trip. This team will move up to Elite 2.

Boys 16 Barca, Classic, record: 5-2-3.

Looks like this team did just enough to earn promotion to Premier 2.

Boys 16 Man U, Classic, record: 2-8-0.

This combination 15/16 team battled hard throughout the season yet came up just a little short.

Boys 15 Red, Premier 1, record: 7-3-0.

The team finished very strong with a 7-3-0 record in Premier 1 for a 3rd place and reached the finals of the Rocky Mountain Cup. This team will move up to Elite 3.

Boys 15 Barca, Premier 2, record: 1-8-1.

The team had a tough year after moving up to the Premier division. The boys played hard in each game yet came up a little short.

Boys 14 Red, Premier 2, record: 4-2-4.

The team came together very well for a strong 3rd place finish in Premier 2. This team will move up to Premier 1.
